1. Course information

1.1 Course aims

Many women with vulvar disease can suffer for years with undiagnosed symptoms.

This online course will provide participants with knowledge and skills that will support their understanding, diagnosis and management of a range of female genital skin disorders from both a clinical and psychological perspective.

1.2 Learning objectives (LOs)

At the successful completion of this course, students should be able to:

- 1. Recall dermatological issues in the context of female genitalia
- 2. Identify the triggers and risk factors for vulval dermatological conditions
- 3. Demonstrate confidence in diagnosing dermatological conditions in the context of female genitalia through an analytical approach to the patient's presentation
- 4. Interpret the clinical clues to diagnosing vulvar-vaginal infections
- 5. Develop appropriate treatment and ongoing management plans
- 6. Interpret the results of the investigations
- 7. Demonstrate empathy for the ongoing social and psychological issues for patients presenting with vulval dermatological conditions.
- 8. Describe how to counsel patients on initial management of vulval dermatological conditions
- 9. Identify situations in which referral to a specialist is the best action



1.3 Learning and teaching activities

The course is organised into seven components.

- **Pre-course Self Reflection:** completed prior to starting the course and includes a self-rating of your current experience/practice in the treating patients.
- **Pre-knowledge Quiz:** to be completed prior to starting the course to help you assess your 'entry level' skills and knowledge.
- Self-paced online units: There are five self-paced online units.
 - 1. Anatomy and normal vulvar variants
 - 2. Vulvar dermatitis and psoriasis
 - 3. Lichenoid Dermatoses
 - 4. Infections
 - 5. Neuropathic pain and dyspareunia

Each unit is comprised of a number of topic specific tutorials. Embedded within these tutorials where appropriate, are 'compulsory practice real patient scenarios' designed to consolidate your learning. Whilst they are compulsory, they are not part of the assessment component of this course.

- Ask the Teacher: These forums are located at the end of each module and are a place where students can post cases and ask questions. Lecturers and other students can provide feedback for discussion. This is an interactive course component.
- **Webinars**: 1 live webinar is held each trimester as part of this course. Attendance or watching the recording is mandatory. Attendance is preferred, as it is an opportunity to interact with your lecturer and colleagues.
- **Final Assessment**: The final assessment for the subject is an online 90-minute MCQ examination, and written responses to 3 'standard real patient' case studies..
- **Post-course Self Reflection:** completed after starting the course and includes a self-rating of your acquired skills and knowledge about vulval dermatology.

Clinical scenarios are the main teaching and assessment tool across all learning modes of the course. They illustrate the essential content in the online modules. They are used to assess the application of knowledge and skills in the end-of-topic tests and final examination.



2. Course structure and content

This course is delivered on a trimester basis which is completed over a 16-week period.

The course consists of a total of approximately 25 hours of student effort. Below is the suggested breakdown of your time:

- 1 hour orientation/getting started
- 14 hours online learning (including tutorial-based practice scenarios
- Over 3 hours virtual lectures and case discussions (webinars and/or recording)
- 1.5 hours Final Online Exam
- 1-hour online case study response
- 4.5 hours additional reading/private research
